




### TOTAL CLIENTS SERVED TRIAGE GRANTS (SB82) - STATEWIDE




### CLIENTS SERVED BY AGE GROUPS TRIAGE GRANTS (SB82) - STATEWIDE





### CLIENTS SERVED BY RACE TRIAGE GRANTS (SB82) - STATEWIDE





### CLIENTS SERVED BY RACE TRIAGE GRANTS (SB82) - STATEWIDE






