MHSA BACKGROUND

- Proposition 63: Mental Health Services Act (MHSA)
- Law went into effect on January 1, 2005
- 1% tax on millionaires

"...to create a state-of-the-art, culturally competent system that promotes recovery/wellness for adults and older adults with severe mental illness and resiliency for children with serious emotional disorders and their families"

MHSA COMPONENTS

- Community Services and Supports (CSS)
 - Focuses on direct services
 - Approximately \$8.5 million for 2018-2019
 - Accounts for about 75% of county MHSA budget
- Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI)
 - Focuses on the prevention of untreated mental illness
 - Approximately \$2.3 million for 2018-2109
 - Accounts for about 20% of county MHSA budget
 - 51% of PEI funds have to be spent on consumers 25 years of younger
- Innovation (INN)
- Capital Facilities & Technological Needs
- Workforce Education & Training (WET)









CSS PROGRAM TYPES

Four Service Categories:

- Full Service Partnership (FSP)
- General System Development
- Outreach and Engagement
- Mental Health Services Act Housing Program







FSP DATA COLLECTION

Required Data Collection

- General administrative data
- Residential status, including hospitalization or incarceration
- Educational status
- Employment status
- Legal issues/designation
- Sources of financial support

- Health status
- Substance abuse issues
- Assessment of daily living functions, when appropriate
- Emergency interventions





GENERAL SYSTEMS

This service category is geared to improve the County's mental health service delivery system for all consumers and/or to pay for specific mental health services and supports for consumers and, when appropriate, their families.

Services may include services to parents, caregivers and other family members of the person with early onset of a mental illness.







OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT

The county uses this funding to engage unserved and underserved individuals and communities in the mental health system in order to increase access to services and reduce disparities identified by the County.





<u>DEFINING TERMS USED</u>: **Underserved:** clients with serious mental illness but are not receiving adequate services **Unserved:** clients with serious mental illness who will not engage in treatment



PROGRAMS IN THIS CATEGORY: 6th Street, Torres Shelter Peer Partner Program, Caminar, Consumer Employment, DOR, Dreamcatchers, & Jesus Center

MHSA HOUSING

MHSA provides housing funds for children and youth who are seriously emotionally disturbed, as well as persistently and seriously mentally ill adults.
