





Annual Data Report to the Community

Los Angeles County

The Los Angeles Suicide Prevention Network (LASPN) releases an annual data report to the community each September during Suicide Prevention Week. The report brings together the most recent data from multiple sources to present a profile of suicide deaths, suicide attempts, suicide ideation and suicide prevention activities in Los Angeles County. The annual Report to the Community is a way to engage cross sectional partners and agencies to show how organizations across Los Angeles County are coming together for suicide prevention. The 2024 report represents the third annual Report to the Community with a special emphasis on youth suicide prevention. Additional pages in the report include information on the warning signs of suicide, crisis resources, and different ways people and organizational can play a role in suicide prevention.







In 2018, the latest year for which suicide attempt data is available, 2,511 Angelenos were treated in the ER for a suicide attempt. Of these, 1,386 (28.1/100,000) were female. The rate was highest for African Americans (43.3/100,000), followed by white (30.8/100,000). Youth were at highest risk for being seen for a suicide attempt: 1,335 were under the age of 25, with the highest rate (84.0/100,000) for young people aged 15 to 19.
