CalVDRS Background

- State based surveillance system
- National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS) through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
- Links multiple sources of data for violent deaths that occur in California
- Related deaths are linked in multi-victim incidents
- Captures information regarding victim demographics, suspect details, fatal weapon(s), toxicology, circumstances



CalVDRS Suicide Dashboard

 Developed to share more data that is collected (i.e. circumstances, toxicology)

- Filter data by county of death, year, and other options
 - Can select multiple counties for a 'regional' look for a single year
 - Can select multiple years for a single county for an aggregate look

About Deaths by Suicide

<u>California Violent Death Reporting System</u>



The California Department of Public Health is funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to participate in the <u>National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS)</u> to compile information on violent deaths that occur in California.

- CalVDRS combines data on violent deaths from various data providers (i.e., vital records, law enforcement, and coroners/medical examiners)
 in one secure and confidential database.
- Data presented here are not representative of all violent deaths. The data presented here summarize violent deaths for which CalVDRS
 received an investigative narrative, autopsy, or toxicology report.
- Violent deaths include suicides, homicides, and deaths where law enforcement is involved. CalVDRS also includes deaths of undetermined intent and unintentional firearm deaths.
- CalVDRS enables us to integrate data reports to piece together a more complete picture of the circumstances and underlying causes of
 violent deaths, to track trends in communities across California, and to translate these findings into actionable information for local and
 state action.



User Guide

Getting Started


Figure 1: Select a dashboard optiton.

The CalVDRS Dashboard currently has a few tabs where information and data are stored. The Home page provides an overview of CalVDRS and has an interactive map of participating counties. The About page has a user guide and methods section. The Deaths by Suicide page summarizes the CalVDRS suicide data. These pages can be accessed by selecting an option from the top blue panel (Figure 1).

How to choose different filters

Dashboard data can be filtered using the options shown in the image (Figure 2-A). Filters are organized under the categories of Year of Death, County of Death, Age Range, Method used to inflict the fatal injury, Biological sex, Race and ethnicity, Education, Marital Status, and Veteran Status. Most filters have a select all/deselect all option for ease of use. Filters will be immediately applied and tables and charts will automatically update based on filter selection. MULTIPLE YEARS: Multiple years can be selected for a single county to aggregate data. MULTIPLE COUNTIES: Multiple counties can be selected for a single year to view data regionally. To clear all filters, click on the "RESET" button at the bottom of the filter panel on the left of the page.
















Changes based on filter options selected








- Unique data source for public health to use that combines vital records, law enforcement, and coroner/medical examiners into one database
- Participating counties can look at their data year over year and aggregated
 - More information than provided in individual county profiles
- Useful for informing suicide prevention planning and suicide awareness activities
